Parliament currently has two chambers, the House of Commons and the House of Lords.

Currently the House of Lords is mostly made up of people appointed by the political parties or by the House of Lords Appointments Commission, which nominates independent Lords. The House of Lords also has seats for senior Church of England bishops and 92 remaining hereditary peers.

Some people have suggested replacing the House of Lords with a mostly or wholly elected chamber, other people think it should be left as it is or abolished entirely
