Shale gas is a type of gas found in rock formations deep underground. It is extracted using a method known as "fracking", which involves drilling both vertically and horizontally up to several miles, and then pumping a mix of water, chemicals, and sand at high pressure to break the rocks and release the gas.

Under current laws, if an energy company wants to drill or "frack" for gas which is found under somebody's home or land they need the landowner/resident's consent, or must obtain special permission from a judge.

The government is considering changing this law, to allow energy companies the right to drill horizontal wells under private property without this consent.
