Currently it is illegal for a doctor to help someone with a terminal illness to control their death, even if the person is suffering unbearably and is of sound mind. A new assisted dying law would mean that a terminally ill adult would have the option to control the time of their death with help from a doctor who would write a prescription for life-ending medication providing that they met upfront safeguards to determine whether they were likely to die within six months, are of sound mind and were informed of all their care and treatment options.
