The Labour party has proposed funding the reduction in tuition fees by reducing tax breaks for pensions. Under the proposals the amount of money people can put into a pension each year tax-free would be reduced to £30,000, the total amount people can pay into their pension tax-free would be reduced to £1 million and tax allowances for pension contributions by people earning over £150,000 would be reduced. Some reports have suggested that the Conservative party will also use money raised from changes to pension savings but will instead use the funds to increase the threshold at which national insurance is paid.
