In 1987, Congress designated Yucca Mountain in Nevada as the national nuclear waste disposal location. In 2002, Congress approved the Yucca Mountain nuclear waste repository project. However, in 2011, in the face of severe local objections - including the Nevada congressional delegation (with former Democratic Senate Leader Harry Reid), Congress and the Obama administration defunded the project as part of a continuing resolution to fund the federal government. In the last week, the U.S. House of Representatives passed a bipartisan, comprehensive nuclear waste bill, by a margin of 340-72, that among other things includes restoring funding to the Yucca Mountain nuclear waste repository project.
