Previously the Labour party elected its leaders using an electoral college, where a third of the vote went to MPs, a third of the vote went to party members and a third of the vote went to members of trade unions that were affiliated to the Labour party.

Under Ed Miliband the rules were changed to a one person one vote system, with party members, registered supporters and trade union members who register as Labour supporters vote to choose the new leader.
