HOW THE POLL WAS CONDUCTED AND THE MARGIN OF ERROR CALCULATED

June 24, 2018

The CBS News 2018 Battleground Tracker is a series of panel studies in the United States. The poll is conducted by YouGov, an online polling company.

This poll interviewed 1,001 registered voters in Arizona, and was fielded between June 19–22, 2018.

The respondents were selected to be representative of registered voters in these districts in terms of age, race, gender, and education. Of the 1,001 respondents, 822 respondents were selected from YouGov's online panel, and 179 respondents were selected from SSI/Research Now's online panel. The sample was weighted according to gender, age, race, and education, based on the American Community Survey, conducted by the U.S. Bureau of the Census, as well as 2016 Presidential vote, and partisan identification. The weights range from 0.03 to 6.52, with a mean of 1 and a standard deviation of 0.7.

The margin of error (a 95% confidence interval) for a sample percentage p based upon the entire sample is approximately 3.7%. It is calculated using the formula

$$\hat{p} \pm 100 \times \sqrt{\frac{1 + \mathsf{CV}^2}{n}}$$

where CV is the coefficient of variation of the sample weights and n is the sample size used to compute the proportion. This is a measure of sampling error (the average of all estimates obtained using the same sample selection and weighting procedures repeatedly). The sample estimate should differ from its expected value by less than margin of error in 95 percent of all samples. It does not reflect non-sampling errors, including potential selection bias in panel participation or in response to a particular survey.
