Junior doctors have voted to take strike action on three separate days in December over a new contract the government is proposing.

On Tuesday 1st December there will be a partial strike, junior doctors will still provide emergency services but other scheduled appointments would be cancelled.

On Tuesday 8th December and Wednesday 16th December there will be a full strike – junior doctors will not work at all, and emergency services will have to be covered by more senior doctors.
