


Figure 1: Trump Approval - All Adults




Figure 2: Trump Approval – Registered Voters




Figure 3: Presidential Approval since 2009 - All Adults




Figure 4: Presidential Approval since 2009 - Registered Voters




Figure 5: Congressional Approval - All Adults




Figure 6: Congressional Approval – Registered Voters






Figure 7: Direction of Country - All Adults




Figure 8: Direction of Country - Registered Voters





Sponsorship: The Economist

Target population: U.S. citizens, aged 18 and over.

Interviewing Dates: March 17 - 19, 2019

Sampling method: Respondents were selected from YouGov's opt-in Internet panel using sample matching.

A random sample (stratified by age, gender, race, education, and region) was selected from the 2014 American Community Study. Voter registration was imputed from the November 2014 Current Population Survey Registration and Voting Supplement.

Weighting: The sample was weighted based on age, gender, race, education, and 2016 Presidential vote.

The weights range from 0.38 to 6.36, with a mean of 1

and a standard deviation of 0.64.

Number of respondents: 1500

Margin of error (All): 3% (adjusted for weighting)
Margin of error (Registered Voters): 3.1% (adjusted for weighting)

Survey mode: Web-based interviews
