An independent, specialist domestic violence refuge is a safe house where women and children who are experiencing domestic violence are given the opportunity to escape, cope and rebuild their lives after domestic violence. The support available in refuges includes counselling, legal information, support to get a job, medical and healthcare information, support programmes, children's support workers and youth programmes.

Data from a national domestic violence charity has shown that many domestic violence refuges are closing down or operating on reserve funds. This is due to funding cuts across the voluntary sector and commissioners that are prioritising emergency accommodation units and outreach programmes over refuges.

Some say that victims of domestic violence are one of the most vulnerable groups in Britain and refuges are vital in protecting and rebuilding the lives of victims. Others say that all areas of the voluntary sector have had to deal with funding cuts, and by still funding some provision for domestic violence victims through other emergency accommodation units, those most at immediate risk are still protected.
