Total If there were a general election tomorrow, which party would you vote for? Labour 39% Conservative 30% Liberal Democrat 23% Other 8% Thinking now of the European Single Currency, which of the following statements would come closest to your own view?

- Definitely join as soon as possible 15%
- Join if and when the economic conditions are right 37%
 - Stay out for at least the next four or five years 21%
 - Rule out on principle 24%
 - Don't know 3%

How well do you think the present government has handled relations with the European Union?

- 5% Very well Fairly well 32%
- Neither well nor badly 29%
 - Fairly badly 21%
 - 10% Very badly
 - Don't know 3%

How much do you trust the government to make the right decisions on euro entry?

- Trust a lot 12%
- Trust a little 24%
- Neither trust nor distrust 10%
 - Don't trust much 23%
 - Don't trust at all 29%
 - Don't know 1%

If there were a referendum today on whether to join the euro, how would you vote?

- In favour of joining 37%
 - Against joining 53%
 - Would not vote 3%
 - Don't know 8%

Which of the following countries do you think has the strongest economy at the moment?

Britain 62% France 7% Germany 10% Italy 1% Don't know 19%

And now, turning to higher education, which of the following best sums up your attitude to university education?

- It's generally worth having 89%
- It's generally a waste of time 9%
 - 2% Don't know

Many of Britain's universities say they are in financial crisis and want to charge students top-up fees above the current £1,100 per year tuition fees. Which of these views do you agree with most?

- Universities should be allowed to charge higher fees to all students 13%
- Universities should be allowed to charge higher fees to students from families whose overall income is more than £30 000 a year **36%**
 - Universities should NOT be allowed to charge higher fees **49%**
 - Don't know 2%

Some people favour an alternative to higher fees and student loans, which is that the universities would get extra income from a so-called 'graduate tax' on earnings above a certain level when the graduates are in work. Do you think this would be prefe

- Yes it would be preferable 53%
- No it would not be preferable 36%
 - Don't know 12%

The Government has set a target of 50% of young people going to university. Do think this target is&?

- Too high 57%
- About right 30%
- Too low **7%**
- Don't know 6%

Would you like to see more or less emphasis on vocational (practical) degrees, or are you happy with the way things are?

- More emphasis on vocational 62%
 - Less emphasis 13%
 - Happy as things are 20%
 - Don't know 5%

Do you think higher fees would deter significant numbers of potential students from going to university, or not?

- Yes would deter significant numbers 81%
- No would not deter significant numbers 16%
 - Don't know 3%

And now turning to the issue of terrorism, there were reports last weekend of a specific planned poison gas attack on the London Underground. The Government subsequently denied the reports. What is your view?

- There was a plan to attack the Underground 41%
 - There was no such plan 22%
 - Don't know 37%

Do you think there will be a major terrorist attack on the UK over the next 6 months?

- Yes there will 49%
- No there will not **19%**
 - Don't know 32%

Which of these views do you MOST agree with?

- The Government should disclose everything it knows about possible terrorist threats because the public has the right to be kept fully informed **35%**
- The Government should not disclose everything it knows because to say too much would be likely to cause too much panic 52%
 - Neither 10%
 - Don't know 2%

When informing the public about possible terrorist threats, do you think the Government is...?

- Telling the whole truth 1%
- Telling the truth but keeping some things hidden 72%
 - Misleading the public 24%
 - Don't know 3%

President George W Bush has recently appointed a head of homeland security for the United States. His job is to oversee all the government agencies involved in fighting terrorism. Do you think it would be a good idea for the Prime Minister to appoint

- Good idea to create new Cabinet post 42%
 - Better to keep present system 47%
 - Don't know 12%

Thinking now about the fire dispute, would you describe yourself as being broadly on the firefighters' side or not on their side?

- On firefighters' side 44%
 - Not on their side 52%
 - Don't know 4%

Latest reports suggest that the firefighters will be offered 16% in return for a commitment to 'meaningful discussions for change'. Do you think the firefighters should accept this offer?

- Should 82%
- Should not 11%
- Don't know 8%

Do you think it is right or wrong that an offer of 16% should be made?

- Right but only with guarantees of change to work practices 42%
 - Right it is the right offer as it stands 16%
- Wrong the firefighters should have been offered less than 24%
- Wrong the firefighters should have been offered more than 15%
 - Don't know 4%
