Do you personally believe that, unless action is taken, global warming is almost certain to accelerate over the next few decades?

- Yes, I think it will accelerate 79
 - No, I don't think it will **11**
- No, I don't believe global warming is occurring at all 3
 - Don't know 7

When you think about those who draw attention to the issue of global warming, what impression do you have of them?

- That they are just scarce-mongers and alarmists **15**
- That they are level-headed people who have good reasons for wanting people to be concerned about global warming **76**
 - Don't know 10

Those who believe that global warming is actually taking place offer a number of explanations. Here are some of them. Please tick all the factors that you believe are contributing to global warming:

- The worldwide increase in the use of cars and other motor vehicles 78
