- Conservative government led by David Cameron 43

Do you think David Cameron is, or is not, proving a good leader of the Conservative Party?

- Yes, he is proving a good leader **39**
 - No, he isn't **30**
 - Don't know 31

Do you think that, from the Conservatives' point of view, David Cameron is moving the Conservative Party in the right direction or the wrong direction?

- He is moving the Conservatives in the right direction **45**
 - He is moving them in the wrong direction **19**
 - Don't know 36

Do you think he is improving the Conservative Party's image, in the sense that people now think better of the Conservative Party than they did before he became leader?

- Yes, he has improved the Conservative Party's image 52
 - No, he hasn't 27
